Nassau County Historian to Speak at Installation Dinner

The 47th Annual Installation Dinner of the Farmingdale-Bethpage Historical Society will be held on Monday evening, October 25, at Bella Napoli Restaurant, 968 Fulton Street, Farmingdale, beginning at 6:00 pm.

Edward J. Smits, historian of Nassau County, will relate the saga of "A Historic Rescue: Nunley's Carousel" following the dinner. Nunley's Carousel was built in 1912 during the golden age of wooden carousels and was a landmark in Baldwin for more than fifty years. Ed Smits will speak about how it was rescued, restored, and opened last year in its new permanent home on Museum Row at Mitchel Field. Our speaker was highly involved personally in the long process of the rescue, which had almost as many "ups and downs" as the forty horses on the carousel!

Please be with us for an evening of an enjoyable meal, pleasant fellowship, and a fascinating chapter of regional history and preservation which ended happily!

FBHS Invited to Hicksville's Eagle Rededication

The Hicksville Historical Society has invited members of the Farmingdale-Bethpage Historical Society to attend the rededication of the Penn Station "eagle" statue at Hicksville LIRR Station on Thursday, October 28, at 11:00 am. The Hicksville society recently sponsored a restoration of the century-old eagle, which was once part of Pennsylvania Station, Manhattan. When the superstructure of Penn Station was razed in 1963, a small number of the eagle statues were salvaged. One was installed a few years later at Hicksville after a financial "rescue" by a teacher and his class at Hicksville High School.

The Farmingdale-Bethpage Historical Society donated to the recent restoration in honor of David Morrison, prominent rail historian, for his generosity to the FBHS.

Mort Kuntsler Civil War Exhibit at Museum of Art

The Nassau County Museum of Art in Roslyn Harbor has opened a Civil War exhibit, "For Us the Living", displaying the work of Mort Kuntsler. Mr. Kuntsler, a resident of Nassau County, has been termed the "foremost Civil War painter of our time, if not all time". Several special events are scheduled at the museum during the exhibit, which runs through January 9, 2011, including a presentation by Mr. Kuntsler. “Long Island and the Civil War” Lecture on Sunday, Nov. 21

Harrison "Terry" Hunt, a trustee of the Society who has studied the Civil War for many years, will speak on "Long Island and the Civil War" at the FBHS general meeting on Sunday, November 21 at 2:00 pm. The program will be presented in the Board Room of Farmingdale Village Hall, 361 Main street, due to the continuing renovation project at the Farmingdale Public Library.

Mr. Hunt's interest in the national conflict of 1861-1865 has led him to be a re-enactor as well as a respected scholar in this field of study. With the 150th anniversary of the Civil War beginning this coming spring, and the Society's Civil War Memorial initiative underway, this program is most timely.

Post Office Sites Focus of Village Walk

Eighteen members and friends of the Farmingdale-Bethpage Historical Society took a walking tour of Farmingdale's Main Street business district on Sunday, September 19, on a sunny but mild afternoon. The main focus of the walk was to note the sites of post offices and names of postmasters throughout the 165 years of the Farmingdale Post Office, which was established on July 31, 1845.

Joseph Carosella Sr., a Society trustee and a longtime Postal Service employee, provided the narration of this portion of the walk. General information on the history of the business district from Hardscrabble days to the present was presented by Vice-President James McCullagh and Trustee Eric Goldschrafe. The walk began at the Village Green and moved north to South Front Street, then returned to the Green.

The Village of Farmingdale walking tours have been a spring and late summer tradition of the FBHS for many years.

Civil War Memorial Drive Underway

The Farmingdale-Bethpage Historical Society has launched the campaign to raise funds for the Civil War Memorial honoring those young men who left the area to serve in the Union Army or U.S. Navy during the 1861-1865 conflict. The dedication of the memorial is slated for next Memorial Day, May 30, 2011, as part of the ceremonies on the Farmingdale Village Green following the annual Memorial Day Parade.
